UC IRVINE: COVID-19 VACCINATION POLICY & FACE COVERING COMPLIANCE



UC IRVINE FACE COVERING GUIDANCE

David M. Souleles, the Director, COVID-19 Response Team, sent a notice to the UCI campus on February 10, 2022 in regards to the state of CA lifting the mandate for fully vaccinated persons to mask indoors. His letter reads:

"Beginning February 16th, this updated state guidance will require indoor masking only for unvaccinated individuals, as well as universal masking (both vaccinated and unvaccinated) only in specified settings outlined in the guidance.

"While this is a positive step acknowledging the decreasing COVID-19 case counts and positivity rates, UCI's executive directive on face coverings will

continue to **remain in place beyond February 15th** This means that universal masking is required in all indoor settings while on UCI property, for all students, staff, faculty and visitors.

OLLI at UCI COVID-19 VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

In the presence of continuing COVID-19 infection risks to its members (and guests), and in accordance with the policies of UC Irvine, Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at UCI (OLLI) will request members to voluntarily provide their



vaccination status, including required booster – being mindful that members present in the classroom desire to be as safe from infection transmission as possible. OLLI will be asking members to provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination at the first class meeting a member attends as well as cover their face with a mask. The first class will focus primarily on an assessment of the first year of Biden's presidency and the second will focus on the midterms.

This brief overview of the world of coffee looks at both the nature of coffee itself and its interactions with world history in two 2-hour classes.

March 1: We will investigate what is coffee? Where and when did it originate and why did it become a drink with that name? Discover the link between coffee, religion, and the emergence of coffeehouses in Ethiopia and the Middle East.

March 8: We jump to Europe and the Americas to think about coffee's relationship to the Enlightenment, revolution, colonialism, slavery, and the Industrial Revolution. The final hour will discuss global coffee today.
