Almost 400 years from publication of Shakespeare's First Folio in 1623, Shakespeare's plays remain a staple in education curriculum and theatre productions. Join this interactive group in reading aloud a play of our choosing,

discussing the characters, plot and major themes. Woven within this interactive reading will be a discussion of the political and social environment of the period. Our discussion will enlighten Shakespeare's intent.

SS 310 Format C GATES TO DESTINY AND HUMAN CIVILIZATION Tuesday, March 16 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM Presentation link available here.

An eternal question is: Where did humans come from and how? Biomedical research finds the human race originated in Africa. The spread of humanity, its civilizations, and cultures have been possible thru waterways. Rivers, maritime straits, bays, and man-made canals have been the major conduits. We will review the ways humans conquered the world and learn about the history, geography, societal development, economies, cultures and inevitably, politics.

MUSICAL GIFTS THAT KEEP ON GIVING
Thursday, March 17

Sometimes musical compositions are so significant that other composers quote them in their own works or write variations on them. Such is the case with the Requiem Mass sequence Dies Irae (Day of Wrath) and Caprice #24 for solo violin by Niccolò Paganini. Versions have shown up in dozens of pieces over hundreds of years and will probably continue to do so as long as composers find inspiration in them. This course examines how the Dies Irae and Caprice #24 have transcended their beginnings to become launching pads for the exploration of new ideas.
