
From the UCI Office of the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor: Hal Stern



Class Descriptions

SC 204 Format B LIVING WELL: USE OF VITAMINS & SUPPLEMENTS IN PREVENTING VIRAL INFECTIONS Monday, March 28 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM Are vitamins C, D, & E helpful for illness prevention or can they cause more harm? Does gargling and getting more sleep when sick actually help you feel better faster? Dr. Saadi will review the latest research to answer those and other common questions. She will review the use of supplements for illness prevention and discuss what has been proven to work and not work for avoiding viral infections, to help you be a healthier you, and best prepare for flu seasons ahead.

An eternal question is: Where did humans come from and how? Biomedical research finds the human race originated in Africa. The spread of humanity, its civilizations, and cultures have been possible thru waterways. Rivers, maritime straits, bays, and man-made canals have been the major conduits. them in their own works or write variations on them. Such is the case with the Requiem Mass sequence Dies Irae (Day of Wrath) and Caprice #24 for solo violin by Niccolò Paganini. Versions have shown up in dozens of pieces over hundreds of years and will probably continue to do so as long as composers find inspiration in them. This course examines how the Dies Irae and Caprice #24 have transcended their beginnings to become launching pads for the exploration of new ideas.
