Class Descriptions

SS 304 Format B THE BIDEN ADMINISTRATION: A Non-Partisan One Year Review/ Anticipating the 2022 Midterm Elections Monday, March 7 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM

This class will examine the goals, accomplishments and failures of the first year of the Biden administration with an eye to two broad questions: What insights does the first year of the Biden administration offer to assess the health of the Constitutional system and of American democracy? How do the accomplishments and failures of Biden's first year position the Democrats and Republicans for the 2022 midterm elections?

The first class will focus primarily on an assessment of the first year of Biden's presidency and the second will focus on the midterms.

Presenter: Louis Desipio, Ph.D., Professor of Political Science at UCI.

AH 103 Format A AMERICAN SHORT STORY MASTERPIECES (Closed) Monday, March 7 1:00 PM - 3:00 PM

This six-class series is a fun, interactive adventure in reading and discussing renowned American short stories. Participants choose a favorite story from the text, develop questions and lead the discussion. Guidance for developing discussion questions and sample questions will be available.

SS 305 INCIDENCES IN THE LIFE OF COFFEE: A Caffeinated Partial World History Format B Tuesday, March 8 1:00 PM - 3:00 PM

This brief overview of the world of coffee looks at both the nature of coffee itself and its interactions with world history in two 2-hour classes.

March 8: We jump to Europe and the Americas to think about coffee's relationship to the Enlightenment, revolution, colonialism, slavery, and the Industrial Revolution. The final hour will discuss global coffee today.

SS 306 Format B ARE WE READY FOR THE NEXT ONE?

Tuesday, March 9 1:30 PM - 3:30 PM

The COVID-19 pandemic demonstrated the severe effect biological threats have on the health and economic well-being of society. There is much to learn to improve our capability to respond to future pandemics. We have made heroic efforts to advance our technology and surveillance capacity, but we need holistic strategies and a systems approach that will better our global health security. In this two-session course we will review our COVID-19 successes and failures, explore approaches to achieving meaningful structural and behavioral change, and discuss why public health should be at the forefront of all policies.

SS 308 Format A RUNNING A POLITICAL CAMPAIGN Wednesday, March 9 1:30 PM - 3:30 PM

What does it take and what is involved in running a political campaign? And how does dark money fit in with all of this? Former Irvine Mayor Larry Agran has been intimately involved in running a great many political campaigns for himself and others - from President of the United States to Irvine City Councilmember, as well as various ballot measures. He will share with us the requirements, the strategies, and his personal experiences.
