

## CURRENT ISSUES FORUM

Discussion Leaders: Bob Greenberg, Alsion Bok, Scott Greenspan, Kathy Nordin, Yasmin Vali, Mike Schlesinger, Mel Roth, Katherine Jones, and Jaime Schvartzman. Hour One - Presentation and Discussion

For the first hour of our Current Issues class session, Mel Roth, a Current Issues Committee member, will present on the topic of China's influence in South and Central America, focused on the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), which is a global infrastructure development strategy adopted by the Chinese government.

The BRI is four-pronged, focusing on Trade, Investment, Technological Development and Energy Development.

We will discuss the alleged goals and strategies of China and some concerns that the USA, the UK and the EU have about the BRI. Some questions we will consider and discuss are the following:

- How do you feel about China's Belt and Road Initiative and its possible consequences for recipient countries?
- Is China using its economic and financial strength to secure political and possibly military advantages in Latin America? Is this a form of economic imperialism?
- 3. What should the US and its allies do in response? Should we assist these countries with aid? If so, what type?
- 4. What do you think China's end goal is?

Hour Two - Potpourri

This is an open discussion of multiple topics with no presentation, starting with suggested ideas from the committee. Here are their topics:

- 1. Should we be educating Chinese students at our universities when they use their knowledge to compete with us, especially in scientific and technical areas?
- 2. There is a significant teacher shortage, why do you think this is happening? What should be done?
- 3. How do you feel about the explosion of tipping in places where it wasn't done before, such as at Starbucks?
