PrisonPandemic: Building an Archive of **Incarcerated Voices During COVID-19** SS 311

Thursday, May 4 1:30 PM - 3:30 PM

Presenter: Keramet Reiter, Ph.D. UC Berkeley, Department of Jurisprudence & Social Policy and co-founder of the UCI PrisonPandemic project.

San Quentin Prison was the epicenter of one of the largest COVID-19 outbreaks in the United States. People in U.S. prisons in 2020 were five times as likely to get COVID-19 and three times as likely to die from COVID-19 as non-incarcerated people. UCI's PrisonPandemic project gives a voice to these numbers.

The project collected thousands of incarcerated people's stories of struggling to survive in prison during the global pandemic. The project provides:

- a model for incorporating marginalized voices into public policy research
- why the pandemic was so deadly for incarcerated people
- insights into what people experienced in prison quarantines from 2020-22
