THE POST-PANDEMIC STATE OF THE ECONOMY AND FEDERAL RESERVE POLICY

SS 313 Tuesday, May 23, 30 1:30 PM – 3:30 PM

Presenter: William Branch is a Professor of Economics at UC Irvine, and Chairman of the Department of Economics. He specializes in the role of expectations and predictions in inflation and stock markets.

Popular accounts link inflation to pandemic-related supply chain interruptions, COVID stimulus programs, loose monetary policy, and high gas/energy prices. In response, the Federal Reserve and other central banks have been tightening monetary policy to avoid a repeat of 1970's era inflation. This course will discuss recent theories and evidence on the causes of inflation and examine the role of current economic policy in creating and fighting inflation.
