This six-session class is an interactive adventure in reading and discussing works by acclaimed short story writers from around the world. Class volunteers select a story from the text or PDF from the internet, develop questions and lead the discussion.

The textbook is One World; a Global Anthology of Short Stories published in May 2009, and available in paper and Kindle, at Amazon.com. "All belong to one world, united in their diversity and ethnicity. And together they have one aim: to involve and move the reader." Be sure to purchase the May 2009 edition, not the more recent one.
