



Set amidst two feuding families in the modern city of Verona, young Romeo (a Montague) and Juliet (a Capulet) are both searching for something more meaningful in their lives. In finding each other, they discover a love that has the power to heal their entire world.

Presenter: Director, Andrew Borba. Andrew is Associate Professor and Co-Head of Acting at UCI. He is cum laude graduate of Brown University, holds an MFA from NYU and is Artistic Director of the prestigious Chautauqua Theatre Company.



Our First Director's Voice Event is coming up on Sunday, November 13th!

It is a production of Romeo and Juliet, directed by Andrew Borba, a gifted actor, director and acting professor.

We are all very familiar with the story and the play. This production has some unique qualities, which Drama Chair, Don Hill sent me:

- The costumes (which will be amazing) and set are being designed by UCI Drama Faculty members Holly Poe Durbin and Efren Delgadillo.
- The show has no specific time frame. It is at times very modern and sometimes very traditional.
- The director is focusing on the difference between the world of the adults (old) and the world of the youth (Romeo and Juliet). A contrast between living by very set rules and social codes and a new generation who wants to love who they fall in love with.
- Since the drama season theme is "How We Heal," the director notes that folks need to see Romeo and Juliet because we as a society have not all learned the lesson that love holds no boundaries. That love does not keep track of wrongs. That love can heal us.

OLLI has purchased 20 tickets for this show.

Cost is \$22 and includes pre-show Director's Talk from 1:00 to 1:40, followed by Matinee Performance from 2:00 to 3:30.



CURRENT ISSUES FORUM

Wednesday, October 13 1:00 PM - 3:00 PM

This course is a lively participatory group discussion of issues that are of current interest and will sometimes be controversial. It meets once a month to discuss current political, economic, and social developments taking place locally, nationally and around the world. In person attendees are expected to engage in the discussion and share different perspectives. Zoom attendees are observation only.

Hour 1 - We'll discuss the California propositions, showing one minute videos from the Calmatters,org website and then opening up for discussion.

Specific propositions to be covered (at a minimum) are Proposition 1 (abortion), both propositions on gambling (26 and 27), arts education funding (28), and Taxes and transportation (30). If time permits we'll cover the remaining few.

Schlesinger, Mel Roth, Katherine Jones, Yasmin Vali, and Jamie Schvartsman Hour 2 - Potpourri

Suggested questions for discussion:

- 1. Should people currently in jail for marijuana convictions be released if their past behavior for which they were convicted is no longer a crime?
- 2. Should the government pay to rebuild communities destroyed by natural disasters?
- 3. Should California have mandatory kindergarten?

The neuroscience behind creativity has puzzled researchers for decades.

Recent evidence suggests that creative arts activities may benefit brain function, potentially reducing risk of cognitive decline and dementia. Yet there is still much to learn about how and why these benefits may occur.

This interdisciplinary class will introduce research between art and brain function.

We will discuss topics such as: neuroplasticity (including the "use it or lose it" hypothesis); how the human brain evolved to favor novelty and exploration; how definitions of art have changed throughout art history (and why that matters for brain health); and the effectiveness of current arts programming.
