## ENERGIZING THE ADULT BRAIN

Wednesday, October 26

Susanne Jaeggi, Ph.D.,  
Professor in Education  
and Cognitive  
Science, Director,  
Working Memory and  
Plasticity Lab, UCI

Dr. Jaeggi's research has been dedicated to understanding how experiences and environmental factors can impact learning across the lifespan. Her research demonstrates that brain plasticity can be promoted through certain interventions, which can lead to long-lasting real-world benefits.

She will focus on interventions that have been created to foster cognitive and brain health in aging. Boundary conditions and individual differences can impact these benefits. Emphasizing focus on individual differences provides important insights to inform the development of more effective interventions to promote brain health.

She will discuss the implications of the findings for learning and plasticity as we age.

Non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD) is now the most common chronic liver disease, and is associated with diabetes, being overweight, hyperlipidemia, and metabolic syndrome.

NAFLD can cause active liver injury and even cirrhosis, and early diagnosis is important to prevent disease progression.

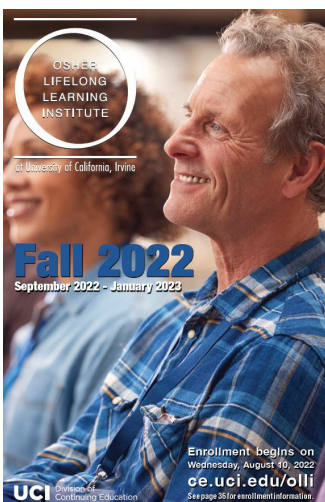
Presenter: Rainer Feldt, taught European history at Saddleback College for 16 years and has served as an AP European History grader for the College Board.
