Please join Mel as he takes us on a happiness journey, exploring happiness ideas and philosophies from ancient times to the 21st Century. Together, we will explore the roles that the following play in the experience of happiness: age, gender, health, marriage, religion, wealth, education, ethnicity and social status.

Finally, we will examine what values, thoughts, and general behaviors enhance personal happiness. The general premise is that the achievement of happiness is a combination of chance, random circumstances, and deliberate personal choices.

Warning: You may leave the class session feeling happier than when you entered!

This warm, supportive class is where you can begin writing down the stories of your life. Share yours and listen to the stories of others in the group.

For those with the goal of creating books to share, you will have an opportunity to learn more about design and printing.

This workshop involves a commitment to attend regularly and write two-page story every two weeks.
