

Hearing loss is the third most common physical ailment in the United States, trailing only arthritis and heart disease. Approximately 15-20% of adults have some form of hearing loss, and by age 65, one out of three people have a hearing loss. We will discuss the various types of hearing loss, the impact of hearing loss on neurocognitive health and safety, and various ways to correct hearing loss.

Presenter: Dr. Harrison Lin, Associate Professor, Otolaryngology, Board-certified otolaryngologist and fellowship-trained in otology, neurology, and skull base surgery. Dr. Lin graduated with honors from Harvard University and received his medical degree from the University of Southern California.



Witch hysteria took hold of Europe in the mid-1400s when *The Hammer of Witches* (Malleus Maleficarum) was published. The book described witchcraft and prescribed witch extermination methods, including burning at the stake. It is argued to have established witch trials during the religious conflict between Protestants and Catholics. The hysteria did not end in Europe, did the pilgrims bring witch-hysteria to America?

Presenter: Helen Brooke, MBA, a 2022 graduate of the University of Durham, has a Masters in Medieval to Post-Medieval Archaeology, specializing in the English Civil War. And iconoclasm in Cathedrals (1642-1651). She will present from her classroom in the UK.



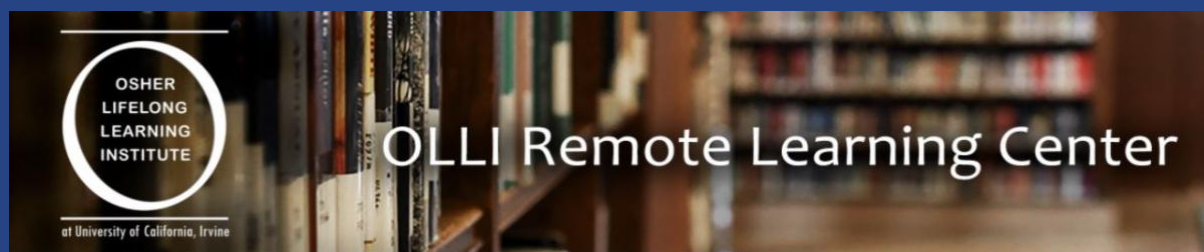

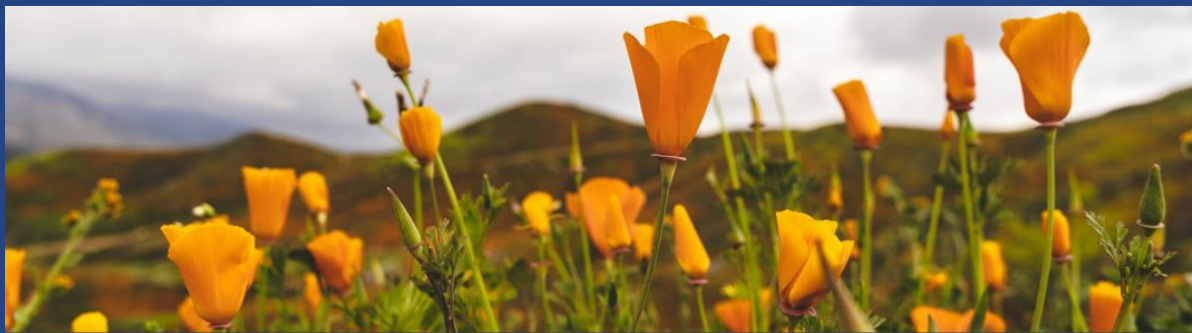
