

ACUPUNCTURE FOR CHRONIC PAIN -EVIDENCE AND PRACTICE

Monday, November 6 10:00 PM - 12:00 PM

Presenter: Richard E. Harris, PhD, Professor and Samueli Endowed Chair, Susan Samueli Integrative Health Institute, School of Medicine, University of California at Irvine. Acupuncture is a millennia-old therapy, which is increasingly being integrated in conventional care for the treatment of a range of conditions, particularly chronic pain disorders. Evidence over the past four decades indicates that acupuncture is more than a placebo but it is also not just the needle.

This lecture will introduce you to the practice of acupuncture, its theory from a Traditional East Asian Medicine perspective, as well as Western biomedical evidence investigating its underlying mechanisms of action. Particular attention will be paid to brain mechanisms operative in chronic pain and acupuncture's clinical effects.

SPELL CHECK WON'T SAVE YOU! (PART 3)

Thursday, November 9 10:00 AM - 12:15 PM (Session 2 of 3)

Presenter: Steve Weinstein, B.A. in English with a minor in music, University of Pittsburgh; and author of the book, *Spell Check Won't Save You!*

We all want to communicate clearly and effectively in writing and in speech, but we can't rely on Microsoft Word to be our copy editor.

This course addresses the common grammatical and usage errors not covered in Fall 2022's Part 1 or Spring 2023's Part 2—errors that often lead to comical, embarrassing and sometimes disastrous results.

The three sessions will include capitalization, the subjunctive mood, comparatives and superlatives, linking verbs vs. action verbs, and much more. Audio-visual aids, wordplay and humor ensure that snoozing is not an option. This is a stand-alone course that does not require prior Part 1 or part 2 attendance.


