

Join us for a relaxing Saturday afternoon with OLLI friends, tasting Pinot's from around the world, chosen by our favorite wine expert and longtime member, Al Glasky. Pinot Noir has a unique profile dominated by aroma compounds known as esters. These give it a complex array of flavors, from ripe cherry and raspberry to intriguing undertones of forest floor, tea leaves, and sometimes even clove. On the nose, Pinot Noir is all about the symphony of red fruits. Yet, it also unveils layers of earthiness, spice, and, when oak-aged, gentle wafts of vanilla and smoke. As it ages, you might catch hints of mushroom and leather. On the palate, Pinot Noir is usually light to medium-bodied, with lower tannins (thanks to thinner skins) and high acidity, making it a wine of grace and subtlety.

ORANGE COUNTY GRAND JURY

Tuesday, October 17 10:00 PM - 12:00 PM

Presenters: Doug Gillen, President of the Grand Juror's Association of Orange County (an alumni group of former grand jurors). John Siragusa was the Foreperson for the recent 2022-2023 Grand Jury. His panel wrote eight civil investigative reports during their one-year term.

This class discusses the Orange County Grand Jury: its purpose, how it operates, and how you can serve on it.

The California Grand Jury is unique in its function and selection process compared to other juries, including petit and trial juries and federal grand juries. Note that we are NOT talking about "Jury Duty".

The Doug Gillen and John Siragusa are going to explain to you how the Orange County Grand Jury operates with respect to criminal indictments and civil investigations.

Doug Gillen who has served three separate one-year terms on the grand jury will start the discussion with a brief overview of the Grand Jury.

John Siragusa will discuss several

of the reports from last years civil investigative reports that received the most attention from the citizens of Orange County, as well as heated responses from some County officials.
